## New poll analysis: Watson, Skinner and Flint facing defeat. Cooper, Miliband, Reeves and Rayner on the edge by Atul Hatwal

Labour is facing a parliamentary wipeout on June 8<sup>th</sup>. The defeat will be greater than 1983 with the leading figures such as Tom Watson, Dennis Skinner and Caroline Flint facing defeat while many others, including Yvette Cooper, Ed Miliband and Angela Rayner, are teetering on the brink.

Currently Labour is set to lose just over 90 seats but a relatively small deterioration of the party's position on the ground could see dozens more fall.

In the East Midlands Labour currently holds 14 seats and is on track to lose nine. Prospective casualties include John Mann, Liz Kendall, **Dennis Skinner** and Margaret Beckett.

"Is this goodbye to my regular column? It has been a great honour to serve as your MEP since 2014. I was, in fact, the only new Conservative MEP elected in those - for the UK, final - European Elections. When selected by Conservative Members across the East Midlands it was on the basis of a pledge that unless the EU was fundamentally reformed I would back leaving.

When the time came and nothing like fundamental reform was on offer, I did what I had pledged to do and supported us leaving. I did so knowing that it could mean that my job would end, maybe even my role in Conservative politics in anything other than a voluntary capacity would also end.

My friend, colleague and fellow Conservative East Midlands MEP Emma McClarkin did the same. We worked well together from day one and have worked especially well together since 23rd June. Emma is a woman of high principle and will continue to serve us well as our MEP.

I may not be leaving politics because I have been selected by your friends and near neighbours in Northampton South to be their candidate in the General Election. If elected I believe I shall be the only person in British history to have served as a Council Leader, an MEP and an MP.

Nothing must be taken for granted, however, very far from it. There are a lot of doors to be knocked on, leaflets to be delivered and people to be spoken to in the meantime, as there is in Corby and East Northamptonshire.

Were the consequences not so serious the joke that is the Labour leadership team would be more funny, but Labour are now reduced to Marxists, IRA sympathisers and the innumerate at their head and must therefore not just be beaten but trounced. Nobody in any part of Northamptonshire will want to wake up to see any part of the county coloured anything but blue.

I would say that the European elite, especially the Commission, has shown their true colours over recent weeks. They seem to have catastrophically misjudged Theresa May and misjudged the reaction to their antics of the majority of British people.

The idea that 100 billion Euros is owed is comical as is that we will be cowed into agreeing a better deal, as if we were a country reduced to supplication and penury like Greece.

One can only hope that the Heads of Government and the European Council get a grip and side-line the Commission (and the European Parliament) as much as possible.

However, if no sensible deal is forthcoming, does this not underline what a dysfunctional organisation the EU is becoming and why a new global future for the UK should be a better one?"

## PCC LAUNCHES POLICE AND CRIME PLAN 2017-2021

Stephen Mold, Police and Crime Commissioner for Northamptonshire, launched the county's **new Police and Crime Plan** on Wednesday, 8th February 2017, which sets the strategic direction for policing in Northamptonshire for the next five years.

The document – which the PCC is required to produce by law within the first year of being in Office – has been compiled in conjunction with feedback from the public, Northamptonshire Police and partner agencies, in order to ensure it represents and caters for everyone involved in public safety in the county.



Keeping the Young Safe; Community Partnerships; Protecting People from Harm and Putting Victims at the Heart of Justice are the four priority areas which form the basis of the Police and Crime Plan, while Transformational Change will underpin the work completed by the Force and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner across the next five years.

In order to equip **Northamptonshire Police** to deliver on the new directive, Commissioner Mold last week announced a £2million investment in to frontline roles, with 46 new posts set to be created.

Mr Mold marked the release of the new Police and Crime Plan with a visit **Guilsborough Academy**, as pupils launched Purple Bow Day as part of Cyber-Safety Week.



Guilsborough pupils won the 2015 Northamptonshire County Schools Challenge – which invites students to develop enterprising solutions to social problems – by designing a purple bow, to remind their peers to use the internet and social media responsibly. An information card that fits in mobile phone cases was also created to assist youngsters online, and the initiative launched for the first time today, with plans afoot for it to become an annual, county-wide awareness day from next year.

Commissioner Mold – who has made Keeping the Young Safe one of four key work strands in his Police and Crime Plan, led an assembly to the Academy before answering questions from pupils around his role and policing in the county.

**Police and Commissioner for Northamptonshire, Stephen Mold, said:**

*"I'm delighted to launch the new Police and Crime Plan for Northamptonshire. I have always said that I would not rush in to creating a new plan for the county, and instead that I would take the time to work closely with those who will play a key role in delivering a safer Northamptonshire to ensure we created a robust, well thought-out vision that will make a real difference to everyone living and working in the county. I believe this is exactly what we have achieved."*

*"Members of my team and I worked closely with Chief Constable Simon Edens and the Chief Officer Team of Northamptonshire Police to establish a plan we are all committed to delivering and confident can be achieved. We also liaised at length with partner agencies, who will play a crucial role in helping us achieve our vision, and invited the people of Northamptonshire to give us their views. The result is a Police and Crime Plan that is not simply mine, it is ours – something owned by everyone in the county that we can all buy in to."*

*"Each element of the Police and Crime Plan has an accountable member of staff in my Office and*

within Northamptonshire Police who will be responsible for delivering positive results in their area to achieve the vision that I have for the county, a vision I know is shared by Chief Constable Edens and Northamptonshire Police.

"Now begins the hard work of making our vision a reality, but this is something I am absolutely determined to achieve."

**Simon Edens, Chief Constable of Northamptonshire Police, added:**

"I am pleased to support the Police and Crime plan which has been built on close collaboration with not only the Commissioner's office, but crucially through hearing the views of the people of Northamptonshire and our partner agencies.

"The plan sets out a clear vision on what we are working towards and I am determined to ensure effective and efficient delivery of this so that we continue to protect people from harm.

"Through the evidence based work we have already achieved and with the additional funding investment by the PCC, I am certain that we have a real foundation for taking the Force forward over the next few years."

**The Conservatives have increased their control of Northamptonshire County Council.**

All 57 seats were contested, of which the Conservatives took 43, compared to the 36 they won in 2013. Labour gained a councillor, taking their tally to 12, while the Liberal Democrats saw their number of seats fall from six to two. There will be no UKIP representatives on the council - all three of their seats were Tory gains.

Turnout was up on 2013, at 33.7%.

In all seats the Conservative percentage of votes was considerably up, and it is particularly good to see that in the Labour core seats in Corby our young candidates increased their share of the votes considerably: West up 16%, Kingswood up 10% and Lloyds up 16%. The figure for Oakley was up 24%. WE ARE GETTING THERE AND LABOUR ARE ON THE RUN!

# AND WHAT ABOUT THAT EU DIVORCE SETTLEMENT?

Daily Telegraph report:

It is 'legally impossible' to enforce demands for Britain to pay a massive £92billion (€100billion) divorce bill, lawyers in Brussels have reportedly privately admitted.

The shock revelation is contained in minutes of a meeting and given to the Brexit negotiation team in Brussels.

But the European Commission has ignored the advice of its own lawyers and pushed ahead with demanding the hefty bill regardless.

The staggering bill has contributed to the poisoning of relations between Britain and the EU.

EU negotiators have doubled the charge the UK was thought to be facing in order to cover farm subsidies and plug the giant hole in its budget up until 2020.

The numbers have shot up because they are trying to deny the UK a share of billions of pounds of assets across the continent - such as buildings.

But it has now emerged that serious questions have been raised over the legality of this position, according to a report in the Sunday Telegraph.

Demands that the UK's share of assets should not be included in calculations of the Brexit settlement were reportedly made at a seminar in February held by Brexit chief negotiator Michel Barnier.

According to minutes of the meeting seen by the newspaper, Nadia Calvino, the director-general in charge of the budget, argued against the idea.

She warned that Europe could not start

'cherry-picking' which parts of the annual accounts it wanted to base its calculations on.

In a separate legal memo seen by the newspaper, Mr Barnier's team warned it would be 'legally impossible' to insist Britain keeps paying for farm subsidies after it leaves the EU in March 2019.

But they appear to have been overruled.

A source told the paper: 'It was the clear view of the Commission that it would be legally impossible to defend the idea that the entire seven-year budget plan was a binding commitment on the UK, and that insisting the UK pay after Brexit would give them an excuse to walk.'

The revelations are a boot for the British government ministers, who have dismissed the huge bill.

Brexit Secretary David Davis has said: "We will not be paying €100billion," he told ITV. 'What we've got to do is discuss in detail what the rights and obligations are.'

He insisted the UK was under no legal obligation to pay anything - saying the bullying tactics from the EU underlined the PM's view that 'no deal is better than a bad deal'

Relations between Britain and the EU have nose-dived after negative briefings against Mrs May from Brussels.

Aides to European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker accused the PM of being 'deluded' and 'in another galaxy' after meeting her for talks in Downing Street.

It triggered a furious response from Mrs May who used a speech outside No 10 to warn that meddling Eurocrats were mounting a desperate bid to interfere in Britain's General Election.

The Duke of Edinburgh has given the most extraordinary public service to this country for more than 60 years


He has inspired generations of young people and helped to transform their lives

## REMAINERS v BREXIT POLL

YouGov reports that support for 'hard remain' is at just 22% among the electorate as remainers continue to switch en masse to embrace Brexit. As June 8 approaches the electorate is overwhelmingly pro-Brexit, with 68% believing that Britain must come out of the European Union. Leavers have been boosted by 're-leavers' who did not support Brexit but say the government has a duty to carry out the democratic will of the people.

YouGov analysis at 5 May says:

*"Simply put, Theresa May is fishing in a massive lake of voters with very little competition. Meanwhile the other parties are splitting the Hard Remain vote among themselves, something that in the first past the post system only serves to make the Conservatives an even more formidable electoral machine."*

# THE MISERABLE OLD GIT - 'WE ALMOST GAVE IT AWAY'

Well, after the manifesto which was clearly not thought through comes a dramatic clarification.

Of course there needs to be a limit placed upon those who end up paying for social care in old age or sickness.
