Dear Members,



At the time of writing my last report, we were eagerly awaiting the outcome of the Leadership contest. As many of you will know, not only did I vote for Boris, I actively campaigned for him, in fact Helen and I hosted a "Back Boris" event. My rationale, when deciding who to vote for, wasn't necessarily who would make the best Party Leader or the best Prime Minister, although I think Boris will be great at both, it was who could win us a General Election.

Well, it looks like a General Election is just round the corner, and I remain convinced that Boris is the best person to lead us into that Election.

Irthlingborough By-election. This by-election was as hard fought as we expected, with Labour literally bussing in activists. On one particular session we came face-to-face with Beth Miller, the Labour Party's Prospective Parliamentary Candidate, who loudly told us that Labour were going to win Irthlingborough on their way to winning Corby and East Northants, and they really did throw everything at it. However, on 8th August we managed to win the seat with just over 53% of the vote. The actual result is recorded elsewhere in this issue of the magazine.

Thanks to everyone who helped out, from stuffing envelopes, to telling, to campaigning and delivering leaflets – it was a great team effort, and one we will no doubt need to repeat in the near future. Taskforce, Canvassing and the incredible doorstep feedback. The regular Saturday Task Force continues to be well attended, with those who are able campaigning or delivering leaflets for an hour or so afterwards.

Recent canvassing sessions across the constituency have started to throw up some bizarre results, so unusual in fact that we checked with neighbouring constituencies to see if we were getting freak results – but they are all seeing the same thing, that being a remarkable number of Labour voters switching their support to the Conservatives – long may it continue.

With Town and Unitary elections next year, and a General Election before that no doubt, we really need to capitalise on the current mood and get as many voting intentions as we can – any and all help will be hugely appreciated. General Election. Amazingly it is Labour who are currently preventing a General Election being called, crazy times. An Election though is unavoidable, we just don't quite know how soon it will be.

What we do know is that, when it comes, we need to be as prepared as possible, and that means having as much data on our voters as we can.

As always, if we can just get our voters out to vote, we should be able to return Tom with an even bigger majority. Fail, and we could easily see a Jeremy Corbyn Government, or maybe more likely a Jo Swinson Government whose first act would be to revoke Article 50 (they aren't even pretending they'd have another "People's Vote" any more).

Even if you can only devote an hour a month to help canvass or deliver, those voters you identify could be the difference between winning and losing. Anyone wanting to see what canvassing is all about can just join a small group and observe.

CENCA – more members than ever before. I have recently been trying to improve our communication with our voters by sending emails to all Conservative pledges for whom we have an email address (you honestly can't imagine how valuable email addresses are to CENCA), which is less than 10% of all Conservative pledges. Emails have included asking voters to Back Boris (after he was elected, not before!), asking them to help with leaflets, and asking them to join CENCA/the Party. You will be delighted to know that, in the last 8 weeks or so, we have managed to increase the membership of CENCA by almost 15%, resulting in a membership of over 400 – more than at any other time in our history. What we need to do now is get members more actively involved.

I would particularly like to thank members of the Management Committee (George, Harriet, Helen, Ray B, Ray J, Richard and Eileen) who really are working incredibly hard to improve communications and contact with our members and voters.

CENCA – Award Winners. CCHQ have this year launched their “Association Incentive Scheme”, a scheme that aims to measure the success of Associations by recording their communication, membership, VoteSource activity and so on. All Associations are automatically entered into the scheme. You will be delighted to hear that CENCA won the East Midlands Region best Association Award, beating Derbyshire Dales into 2nd place with High Peak coming in 3rd .

When you elected me as your Chairman, I committed to lead from the front, to increase membership, to support Tom, to get more Conservative Councillors elected and to prepare for the forthcoming elections. With the invaluable assistance of the team, we are getting there. With the continued help and support of the wider Membership, we really can make Corby and East Northants solid, long-term, Blue.

I have just watched Jeremy Corbyn's speech in Corby today when he said Margaret Thatcher closed Corby Steel Works. However, it closed in April 1979 under Callaghan's Labour government and a full month before Margaret Thatcher came to power.

Unfortunately Margaret Thatcher is no longer able to defend herself against these false accusations. Your own Sherelle Jacobs made a similar mistake when she appeared on Radio 4's Any Questions on 24th May. She commented on the closure of Bilston Steel Works which she had remembered as it destroyed her grandfather's life when it closed in 1980. This was, she stated, in Margaret Thatcher's first term of office but like Corby it was closed in April 1979 under Callaghan. The correct date is firmly fixed on my mind as my father worked at Corby Steel Works and I remember it as I was at university at the time.

Similarly on the Channel 4 news programme at 7.00pm on 25th July it was stated that Ravenscraig Steel Works was closed by Margaret Thatcher in 1992.

Margaret Thatcher's Ministry ended in 1990 and she was subsequently replaced by John Major.

Despite several letters and emails to both Ms Jacobs and also to Channel 4, I still await a reply.

It is unfortunate that when wrong information is given out on live radio and TV programmes it cannot be unsaid, so how can it be corrected?

The closure of Corby Works (and Bilston) was announced in February 1979 and the closures took place in the April. Interestingly it was a nationalised company in those days! And of course, it is never mentioned that the problems on our railways are largely due to the nationalised Network Rail rather than the privatised rail operators.

REPORT IN RESPONSE TO CCHQ QUESTIONNAIRE

9 Attendees.

Meeting held on 15th August 2019

Start by getting Brexit concluded once and for all because it has ruled our political thinking for the last three years. Boris has started to talk about crime, Police numbers and the NHS. This should be encouraged so that the general public follow his lead and discuss matters that really are important. Another subject close to our hearts was the recruitment of labour from the rest of the world not just Europe. As one of our members said "the world is not enough - now Trump that".

Universal credit is a good idea but has been badly implemented. The system must be simplified and made more user friendly.

Raise the personal allowance so that more people are taken out of tax altogether, this would further encourage employment.

All countries that trade in this country should pay tax, including google and amazon etc. People like James Dyson who puts his wealth to the benefit of our society by building his own places of education should be encouraged.

Transport, tourism, environmental health, social housing and sporting facilities ie anything that needs local knowledge should be funded by local communities.

We all agreed that we did not mind paying higher taxes for more police and a better NHS. BUT we must be able to see the improvements.

Luxury items such as jewellery should be taxed at a higher rate (30% VAT) but the more essential items such as electricity should be tax free. Tax should be levied on electric cars because the lithium in the batteries is both rare and difficult to recycle most of which is both produced and returned to China.

More products should be manufactured in this country such as fridges and parts for motor cars. Warehouses should be converted from stores for imported products to production facilities all encouraged by tax incentives. This would stop the problem of last minute deliveries.

Improve schooling to teach more practical subjects such as brick laying, plumbing, carpentry, especially mechanical engineering.

The priority should be in more basic skills such as everybody should be able to read, write and speak English to a high standard before road, rail and fibre.

Rail should be improved so that more freight can be taken off the roads, as was done in the 1950s.

HS2 should be cancelled because capacity is more important than speed. Better fibre connections should be available to everybody even in our rural areas not just for those in our cities.

Invest in the youth of Britain so that we would not require so much from abroad.

Talk to top business men rather than bankers and consultants. The people that run companies such as Next or Wetherspoons understand finance better than those such as Mr. Carney who is always trying to talk the country down.

Better credit control - no more unsecured loans.

Encourage more free trade this will be easier after Brexit.

All MPs who voted against the wishes of the people over Brexit should be deselected. If they are not with us then they are against us.

Open Letter from Sir Bill Cash, MP

Sir - Philip Hammond has never understood Brexit. He says that "leaving the EU without a deal would be just as much a betrayal of the referendum result as not leaving at all." He further asserts that the British people did not vote to leave the European Union without a deal.

In fact, and in law, the vote to leave, which was a significant majority, was implemented by the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018. The statutory law of the land is that this repeals the European Communities Act 1972 on October 31, 2019.

He, and every other Conservative Member of Parliament, voted for this Act of Parliament. He also voted for the Referendum Act and the Notification of Withdrawal Act. The statutory law of the land is also that if there is no Withdrawal Agreement within two years or an agreed extension of time, then we leave without a deal.

To seek to reverse these Acts of Parliament is the real democratic betrayal - not only of the referendum, but also on Mr Hammond's own votes in Parliament, which he very clearly cast on behalf of his own constituents.

Indeed, this week's ComRes Poll (15 Aug) shows that 62 per cent of people who expressed a view think Boris Johnson is more in tune with the British people than Parliament.

NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE JOINT COMMITTEE

FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE UNITARY COUNCIL PLANS

Councillor Martin Griffiths was elected Chair of the North Northamptonshire Joint Committee . Councillor Tom Beattie was elected vice chair.

The currently understood timeline of Local Government Reorganisation in Northamptonshire anticipates the creation of a unitary authority for North Northamptonshire with elections for the shadow authority planned for 7th May 2020, at which point 78 new members for North Northamptonshire would be elected. The shadow authority would then have until 1st April 2021 to ensure everything was in place to allow the new unitary authority to adopt the powers of the County Council and existing borough and district authorities.

The Northamptonshire Structural Change Order (SCO) was anticipated to be laid before Parliament after the 2019 Summer Recess. Completion of the Parliamentary process on the SCO might be expected by the end of 2019. The first meeting of the Shadow Authority would take place within 14 days of the designated election day of 7th May 2020. Therefore, it is estimated, the first meeting of the Shadow Authority would take place

by the end of May 2020. In summary, the role of the Shadow Authority will be to do all that is necessary to prepare for the establishment of the North Northamptonshire Council in April 2021 and the taking on of full local government functions and powers from that time. Until April 2021, the Shadow Authority will have no service delivery role as the current Councils will continue in existence until then.

Much of the preliminary work of the Joint Committee involves the planning of the structure of the new unitary authority and the appointment of Interim Head of Paid Service (HoPS); Interim Chief Finance Officer (CFO); Interim Monitoring Officer (MO); and if appropriate a Returning Officer (RO) for the purpose of the first elections to the new unitary body; and to recommend a recruitment process for the selection of Permanent Head of Paid Service (HoPS).

The Transformation committee meets regularly and reports that the County Council is fighting hard to keep to the budget. Children's Services are still costing a lot but everything else is coming under control. Most problem areas have been addressed.

To book an appointment, please telephone 020 7219 8043, as Tom has decided to operate his surgeries on an appointments basis, in order to ensure that constituents do not have to rush through their concerns. This approach also allows Tom to provide immediate help - he often makes a start on casework matters prior to an appointment, to try and resolve concerns more quickly, whilst it also allows him to seek any appropriate advice, or obtain clarification on technical points, in advance of the meeting.

Parts of the EU are slowly coming to the realisation that the UK is serious about No Deal – the *Telegraph* carries the headline “Brussels expects no deal” while the *Guardian* has “PM intent on hard Brexit and has no desire to renegotiate, EU told.” The EU’s previous calculations have centred around the assumption that Parliament will be able to block no deal, and failing that the UK Prime Minister will back down anyway. *They are gradually waking up to the fact that this is no longer the case...*

EU officials are now putting out spikey quotes including: “It was clear UK does not have another plan. No intention to negotiate, which would require a plan. A no deal now appears to be the UK government’s central scenario.” This is not accurate, Boris has made clear he will negotiate if the EU drops the backstop. *Evidently EU officials have forgotten that “negotiating” does not consist exclusively of grovelling for concessions at Barnier’s door like May did...*

However, the memo doesn’t appear to have reached as far as stagnating Germany yet, as according to *Bloomberg*, German officials are still banking on Parliament blocking No Deal, even as Remainers start to grasp at increasingly desperate schemes.

LABOUR VOWS TO ABOLISH PRIVATE SCHOOLS

Labour will campaign to abolish all private schools after activists voted in favour of making the policy part of Jeremy Corbyn's next general election manifesto.

Holly Rigby, a spokeswoman for the Abolish Eton campaign, said: 'This is what a democratic Labour Party look like. We will dismantle systems of privilege and inequality and build a society that works for the millions and not the millionaires.'

Tory MP Ben Bradley said campaigning to abolish private schools when a number of senior party members (including Diane Abbot and Shami Chakrabarti) have had their children educated privately them would amount to 'blind hypocrisy'.

I have to say I am angry and very frustrated at the decision by the Development Control Committee of Northamptonshire County Council to approve the Shelton Road waste incinerator proposal yesterday. I firmly believe this is the wrong decision on so many levels and that it flies in the face of local feeling, ignoring the very grave concerns - environmental, heritage, and in relation to local housing delivery - set out so eloquently in the many objections submitted by local residents, the other local authorities, and by me as your local Member of Parliament on behalf of my constituents. From my perspective, and that of many local residents and local councillors, there were enough planning grounds on which to throw these plans out, or at the very least, pause for thought and investigate further. Unfortunately, apart from a legal challenge of the decision, or an appeal on the basis of a procedural technicality, there is virtually nothing that can be done to reverse the outcome of last night's meeting. Not only is a legal challenge very difficult to mount, but it also requires significant financial outlay for concerned parties.

This is all extremely disappointing and I feel let down - yet again - by the Development Control Committee of Northamptonshire County Council, as I know so many of my constituents will too.



In the end, much has been said about the move to a new unitary authority - and this is of course no consolation today - but one of the big positives will be that significant strategic decisions currently taken remotely in Northampton, like this, with no reference to the views, feelings, and realities of life for people in the North of the county, will be a thing of the past. Instead, in future, those decisions will be taken in North Northamptonshire, by North Northamptonshire people, on behalf of North Northamptonshire.

I want to pay tribute to all those local residents who took the time to stand up and be counted on this and who have run a tireless and energetic campaign. In our part of the county, we got it right on this and urged NCC to listen and refuse these plans. Instead, they refused to listen and in so doing, ultimately let us down

JEREMY CORBYN'S SPEECH TO THE TUC CONFERENCE

10 Sep 2019

Recently addressing the TUC Jeremy Corbyn (in a luke-warm speech) said he wanted to give state officials the right to enter workplaces and prosecute bosses. The worst offenders could even be sent to prison. He told the conference that he would deliver the biggest extension of workers' rights ever seen if he won the next general election. Zero-hours contracts would be banned and a workers' protection agency set up to rein in 'bad' employers. Mr Corbyn pledged to revive collective bargaining, a policy that once led to widespread industrial strife



Mr Corbyn wants to repeal the 2016 Trade Union Act, which stops many unions from going on strike unless a significant number of workers take part in ballots. Electronic and workplace ballots would make it easier to organise strikes, and there will be greater protection for union representatives against unfair dismissal. Unions will also be given the right of entry to workplaces to organise and represent members.

Business chiefs at the CBI warned the radical proposals would damage the economy. But Mr Corbyn compared company bosses to 'dictators'. He said: 'Why should democracy end when you walk into work? Why should the place where you spend most of your day sometimes feel like a dictatorship?

'In the next few weeks the Establishment will come after us with all they've got, because they know we're not afraid to take them on.' He continued: 'We're going after the tax avoiders. We're going after the bad employers. We're going after the dodgy landlords. We're going after the big polluters destroying our climate. Because we know whose side we're on.'

Mr Corbyn said Labour's proposed ministry for employment rights, headed by a Cabinet minister, would be responsible for delivering a huge expansion of individual and collective rights at work. The workers' protection agency would be tasked with enforcing the law and ensuring that all employees receive the proper rights and protections. It would be given wide-ranging powers to inspect workplaces and bring prosecutions and civil actions on behalf of staff. There would be tougher penalties for defying court orders. A Labour government would also introduce collective bargaining across industrial sectors by establishing councils of worker and employer representatives.

Bosses will be forced to bring in gender pay audits and allow their staff to work flexibly. Mr Corbyn told the TUC: 'The next Labour government will bring about the biggest extension of rights for workers that our country has ever seen. We will put power in the hands of workers. Labour is on the side of the people in the real battle against the born-to-roy Establishment that Johnson represents.' Mr Corbyn confirmed plans to put workers on company boards and give tenants more rights including a cap on rents. He added: 'We'll bring rail, mail, water and the national grid into public ownership, so the essential utilities that people rely on are run by and for the public.'

COMMENTS

Paul Scully, deputy chairman of the Conservative Party, said Mr Corbyn would wreck the economy and let militant union barons hold the country to ransom.

He added: 'Every Labour government leaves more people out of work. Under the Conservatives, we've seen unemployment falling to a record low and wages rising for working people.'

Corbyn's radical plans were unveiled as official figures showed that wages are growing at their fastest for a decade and unemployment is at its lowest level since 1974. The Tories said that Labour's plans would mean a return to the wildcat strikes and flying pickets of the 1970s.

POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER STEPHEN MOLD



11 Sep 2019

A lot has happened over the summer and I am very pleased that the new office base in the Corby Cube for Northamptonshire Police will mean local Response officers will be spending more time in and around the town from next month.

From September 20, Response officers will use the facilities at the Corby Cube in George Street, in a move which will see the town's Neighbourhood Policing Team also relocate from Deene House.

Corby Cube already houses the Police Enquiry Desk on the first floor of the council building, which is open for the public to visit and get advice, report incidents and traffic collisions or enquire about property amongst other things.

The new office base will bring the town's policing resources under one roof in a central location, which will help to increase both the responsiveness and visibility of officers in Corby and surrounding villages.

This will also mean that Response officers will be able to complete any office-based work in Corby without having to return to the Force's Northern Accommodation Building in Kettering during their shift.



The office base is part of the Chief Constable's plans to reshape the Force and comes from our shared desire to make sure Northamptonshire Police is visible and accessible in the

communities it serves but at the same time, able to respond effectively.

This is a positive move which will enable Response officers to remain in and around Corby between incidents and while carrying out related tasks.

"I will always prioritise investing in frontline staff rather than maintaining buildings because our people – not our buildings – keep the public safe.

In the longer term, we will see a joint police and fire hub on the site of the fire station that give Corby a true response and neighbourhood base that supports the delivery of high-quality services to the public and is also efficient and affordable.

The move to the Corby Cube will be an interim one while work takes place to create a new joint police and fire hub on the site of the town's existing Corby Fire Station in Phoenix Parkway.

In addition to this new base, a new policing model, which will be in place from this autumn, will see the creation of two local policing areas in the north and west of the county and will ensure that there is better ownership, accountability and flexibility from Northamptonshire Police.

This will mean that criminal investigation and other core functions are locally based.

This is just one of a package of measures aimed to improve the performance of Northamptonshire Police. Recent developments include:

- A 101 call-back pledge so that no-one ringing with less urgent matters will have to wait more than five minutes to be answered or offered a call back
- The introduction of a new investigation team at Wootton Hall so that now victims of less serious crimes will be contacted in a timely way by an investigator, who provides a single point of contact and deals quickly and efficiently with their crime report, identifying any investigative opportunities and giving professional advice

A new approach to household burglary so that every victim is visited by police. This combined with Operation Crooked, is projected to reduce the number of offences by up to a third over the next few months

Since I appointed the Chief Constable last July, he has identified and taken a grip of issues that have affected the force and he has a clear plan to improve performance. Already we have seen a much stronger focus on dealing with crime and a commitment to robust enforcement.

When we receive the report from our Inspectors in September, I still believe it will tell us that there is a lot of work to do. But there has been a lot of progress since the inspection – which took place last year – and I want people to feel the difference in the policing service they receive."

As you know I have invested in increasing the number of front line officers. A major new recruitment campaign has now begun to increase applications and help bolster the ranks. The Force is using the strapline #FitTheBill and an inspirational video, available on the Force website and YouTube channel, is hoping to motivate and attract applications from a diverse background.
