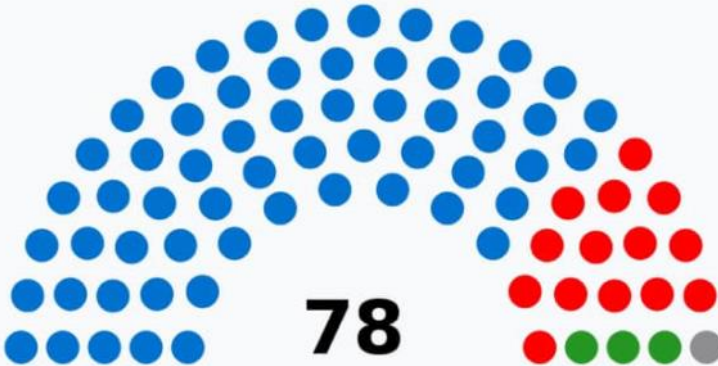

Elections! On 6th May the elections were finally held. Locally residents voted for the new Unitary Council as well as a number of local Town and Parish Councils.



Due to the coronavirus restrictions, our normal campaigning programme had been severely disrupted and an entire election campaign had to be squeezed into a few short weeks. The effort from members was immense. Candidates and Volunteers from across North Northamptonshire worked together to cover the entire region – with leaflet delivery and canvassing taking place daily. It was yet again proof of how well CENCA and the Wellingborough Association work together, with members of each supporting one another. It was also great to see the Raunds/Irthlingborough, Oundle/Thrapston and Corby Rural/Oakley campaign partnerships working so well.

There are too many people to mention individually, but in amongst a huge concerted team performance, there truly were some super human efforts by some – you know who you are.

So after 100,000's leaflets were delivered, and 10,000's of doors knocked, the electorate finally went to the polling stations.

And the results.....

The Conservatives won 60 of the 78 available unitary seats across North Northamptonshire, also taking 8 out of 12 Irthlingborough Town Council seats, and 12 out of 12 Raunds Town Council seats. (Full voting results are in this issue of the magazine

We were also, after a tremendous effort, within a whisker of winning the 3 Oakley Unitary seats. Next time!

SHOULD PHOTO ID BE USED AT FUTURE ELECTIONS?

In order to vote in an election in most of the UK, you don't have to show identification or even a polling card. The government says photo ID will reduce the potential for voter fraud in our current system.

The Electoral Commission calls for tighter rules on voter ID and the government's Electoral Integrity Bill would answer this.

But is there a lot of voter fraud? Very few convictions for impersonation of a voter have occurred in the past. Many campaigners are accusing the government of trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. But it is an issue that concerns some voters.

In 2016 the former Conservative cabinet minister Lord Pickles published a report into electoral fraud, saying: "Despite the low numbers of allegations and rare cases of personation being prosecuted, there is a concern that the absence of evidence does not mean this practice is not taking place.

There are a great number of people who don't have any form of photo ID and trials in 2018 and 2019 in some

areas it was reported that many people were turned away from polling stations as they did not have identification. But 99% of voters who turned up did vote showing that requiring ID does not appear to significantly affect turnout.

The main problem seems to be identifying just what form of ID is acceptable. In Northern Ireland, where the ID system is used, the authorities will supply an electoral card free of charge but whether this free system would be adopted in the rest of the UK is not known.

Ownership of certain forms of ID varies between demographic groups which leads to accusations that these voters will be disenfranchised.

In 2004 David Blunkett, the then Home Secretary, wanted a new biometric ID card that would eventually be mandatory, with personal data from the cards stored on a government database. Boris Johnson was completely against this idea. However, the new bill is not a move towards compulsory ID cards. Boris has said that he didn't think it was unreasonable to ask first-time voters to produce some evidence of identity.

When you get the call, get the jab!

27 May 2021



Week on week we are seeing increasing numbers of people being vaccinated against the terrible COVID-19 virus and locally, the roll-out continues apace. In fact, over 70% of people nationally have now had one dose and that figure is growing all the time - a very significant achievement and a credit to so many who have all played their part in making it happen. I myself have now had the call and have booked in my two doses, the first being at the end of this week - a much anticipated moment personally, as part of our national drive to get everyone vaccinated and the country back to normal. Please, when you get the call, get the jab!

Nothing about the last fifteen months has been easy and we have undoubtedly had our difficulties here in North Northamptonshire, particularly two or three months back when our infection rates were some of the highest in the country - businesses have faced unprecedented challenges of survival and all

our lives have been adversely affected in one way or another, and it is rare to find someone who hasn't lost somebody they knew or loved. It has been hard, gruelling, exhausting and relentless - so many descriptives spring to mind and I could fill this entire column with those alone.



In response, over the last few months we have seen increased vaccine supply and significant uplifts to our testing capacity - the latter designed to help identify chains of infection, so that they can then be shut down. Clearly, testing and vaccination continue to be our best tactics in tackling this persistent challenge and I've been impressed with the consistent above and beyond efforts and dedication of our local public health leaders in delivering the various testing and vaccination initiatives, with capacity having been building all the time. Indeed, it was a real pleasure to meet a few of them and to say 'thank you' when I visited the Moulton Park vaccination centre a few weeks ago.

But we cannot be complacent and all of this certainly still matters when you consider reports about new 'variants of concern'. Continuing to keep infection rates down as far as we can as we move along the path back to normality is eminently sensible, with the latest easing of restrictions having come into effect on Monday 17th May - something that was no doubt a very welcome step forward and a relief to so many. I have to say it is great to see our local sporting facilities back open, our cafes and restaurants fairly busy again and our High Streets coming back to life.

We must sustain the progress we are making and that is why the easing of the restrictions is gradual - there are of course things we would all like to resume doing straight away, but nothing about COVID-19 has been linear

and nor can the easing of restrictions be either. Instead, we are moving gradually, and irreversibly forward, and the good news is that there isn't seemingly now long to wait - the Government's clear and stated ambition remains to dispense with the restrictions altogether on the 21st June.

In light of all the above I wanted to help magnify some of the latest official statistics that have been released recently (published on the 20th May 2021) that are certainly very heartening and illustrate the continuing progress of the COVID-19 vaccination programme here in Northamptonshire - the very roll-out that is making the much desired return to normality possible. Namely, over 600,000 total doses have now been given, which breaks down to nearly 400,000 first doses administered and over 200,000 second doses, all of which are increasing massively week on week. It has been a truly remarkable effort and the hard work continues to see this through.

Ultimately, our performance in emerging from this crisis is very favourable so far when considered relative to other countries around the world, with many of our neighbours in sustained 'lockdowns' with no end in sight, but for now we must maintain our commitment to the common sense, but undoubtedly highly undesirable and inconvenient restrictions that are still in place, to sustain our progress for a little while longer - and I am confident we will.

With that in mind I want to again profusely thank all those who are helping to deliver the ongoing response to this pandemic on the ground here in Northamptonshire and to everyone in our community who has, and continues to, do their bit to make this work - simply put, it is a monumental effort and we couldn't do this without you. Let's keep following the guidance, let's get our vaccines when we get the call, and let's keep this progress going. We are getting there!

Northamptonshire PFCC Stephen Mold's Newsletter

24 May 2021

It is a great honour to have been elected for a second term as Northamptonshire's Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner and I would like to thank all of you for your work and support that made this victory possible. As I begin a second term, my focus is to consolidate and build on the work I have undertaken over the last five years to make Northamptonshire a safer place to live.

I would also like to thank the people who have put their trust in me and recognised just how far we have come in improving policing and fire services in Northamptonshire. We have more police officers and firefighters than for we have had for many years - we have recruited more than 200 police officers with 130 more to come and we have 32 additional firefighters.

It's the quality of the service we provide that really matters to people, and the way that we focus on their priorities so that police and fire services are fundamentally grounded in the communities they serve. Almost one third of Northamptonshire Police officers have served for less than four years, and I want to see them embedded to become fully experienced officers who will make a major difference to the safety of the county.

Looking forward it is my intention to prioritise work to safeguard children and young people and to ensure that their lives are not blighted by crime and the establishment of the two new unitary authorities for Northamptonshire offers a unique opportunity.

This is a huge moment when we can all take a pause, refocus our efforts across the two new authorities, police and fire to intervene early to protect children and prevent them falling into or becoming a victim of crime. Tackling domestic violence is a significant part of that. This is an investment in the future of young people that ultimately reduces demand and makes us all safer.

I will further prioritise neighbourhood policing and embed the new neighbourhood model across all communities. I will ensure that we



make the very best use of our increased resources to provide a strong, visible presence in all communities - rural and urban - across Northamptonshire. We will soon have more police than ever before. I will be expecting to see more positive outcomes and investigations and a consistently high-quality service that prevents crime and makes people safer.

In addition to this work, I will also ask the Chief Fire Officer to continue to bring forward the improvements in service and new ways of working that are already making an impact in Northamptonshire. Our two, vital emergency services are working more closely than ever before and already share buildings and support: I will expect them to embrace closer working on every level, to better protect people and promote safety in Northamptonshire.

Finally, I want to thank and pay tribute to the police officers, firefighters and staff who have worked hard to deliver and improve our vital emergency services. It has been a privilege to work alongside them and an honour to be able to support them to do even better for the public they serve over the next three years.

As a resident of Corby I will be watching closely to see if there is any attempt to make the town councillors a paid job— a cost which will obviously go on our rates!

At this time the actual area of responsibility of the new Corby Town council (now dominated by 17 Labour councillors) has not been determined yet. It is known they are responsible for the green spaces and the hanging baskets but the new councillors have yet to be told of their actual role following the demise of the old Corby Borough Council.

CORBY CONSERVATIVE CLUB NEWS

The Club opened up again with restrictions on 17 May from 12noon every day. The current plan is to reopen with normal service on 21 June

The Committee is already contacting various bands able to provide entertainment once the lockdown is totally over. It is hoped that the very popular August Bank Holiday gig will be able to go ahead and the monthly entertainment in the Games Room will resume.

The Secretary reports that the Club has had a lot of enquiries for private bookings and is trying to fit them in around those which were postponed last year. Last year's Christmas Day lunch was cancelled because of the pandemic and almost everyone has transferred their booking to this year - so, incredibly, Christmas Day Lunch is fully booked already.

Many members have been asking about subscription payments. A large number pay by standing order and these have gone through as normal. Since reopening many members have been in to renew and the Club will be contacting those outstanding during June. Nobody will lose their membership because of the pandemic.

Club committee meetings have resumed and the postponed AGM will go ahead in a few month's time. The 2020 accounts have already been audited.

200 CLUB NEWS

No monthly draws have been held for our club since March 2020. There are three reasons:

1. We couldn't meet up to draw the numbers,
2. We couldn't write cheques as signatories could not be visited, and
3. It would have been difficult for winners to actually get to their banks to deposit their cheques.



Members should not worry though as we **will** be drawing all the winners for 2020 and 2021 once we can get together again, so there will be a bumper payout.

Our plan is to hold our annual lunch at Glaphorn in August when we will draw the winning numbers, including the big one for December 2020.

As soon as the lockdown ends we will book the Glaphorn village hall and invitations will be sent out to all members.

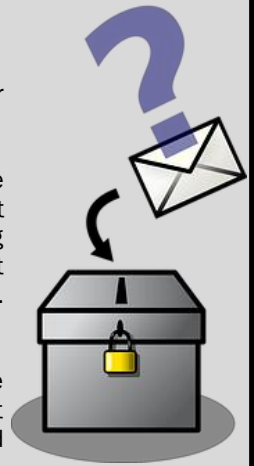
The next few days of this campaign will be crucial and every penny counts.

NATIONAL INSURANCE SCAM

Dozens of people have been targeted by this UK scam over the past few months. Action Fraud data shows it is the most reported phone scam of this year so far, having received more than 1,000 reports.

One victim said that when he returned the call he was falsely told that someone had been using his National insurance number to claim Universal Credit.

The scammer told him that if he didn't hand over his personal details so they could make a 'correction' he would be liable to repay thousands of pounds in fraudulently claimed benefits and could be sent to prison. At this point he realised something wasn't right and put the phone down, but the scammers continued to try and get in touch with him for more than a week

DELIVERY SCAMS

Hermes, Royal Mail and DPD have all reported a sharp rise in scam texts and emails. Do not click on the link in any of their communications.

If you do it will take you to a webpage which advises you that you must make a small payment (usually under £2). You then have to fill in your credit card details, etc. Then they have you.

Don't think it won't happen to you - a member reports that she clicked on the link and since then has been receiving phone calls which appear to come from the Fraud section of her bank. They have even tried to get her to transfer her bank balance to a new 'safe' account. They still keep ringing even though she puts the phone down on them.

HERMES: We attempted to deliver your parcel on 19/04/21. Pay a £1.57 redelivery fee at [reroute-fees-hermes.com](https://www.hermes.co.uk/fees-hermes.com) to avoid your parcel being returned to sender.

Census: We still haven't received your form for Census 2021. You must complete this by law or you could be fined up to £1000. Please complete this here: <https://census-application.co.uk>
