Going to the EU? Ensure you've a valid GHIC or EHIC - millions expire this year. If you plan to travel to the EU, these cards give you access to state-run hospitals or GPs at the same price as a local. So if it's free for them, it's free for you. If you've the old European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), check it is still valid. If you don't have one, since Brexit it's been replaced by the Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) you can get a GHIC for FREE. Never pay for either card (not even if they promise fast track - that's a scam).

Conservative Association Chairman's Report to Members

Dear Members,

I must record my horror and shock over the violent invasion of Ukraine by Putin, a power mad despot who seems intent on trying to rebuild the USSR before his time is up. Every day the invasion gets closer to becoming a war of attrition. The resilience of Ukrainians defending their country, their families, their very existence, is incredible.

Russian/Ukraine War: This war is impossible to ignore - not only is every news bulletin filled with horrific images of Russian bombings, Ukrainian families fleeing, or soldiers bravely defending their homeland - but on a local level, we can see food prices increasing, energy prices rocketing, and of course the immense efforts everyone is making to "do our bit" and support Ukraine and its people wherever possible. Of course "doing our bit" doesn't even begin to describe the outpouring of kindness and generosity that the people of Northamptonshire, and our entire country, have shown. On a practical level, the difficult task now begins on the resettlement process to ensure it safely meets the short and long term needs of those fleeing this bloody war.

Homes for Ukraine scheme: North Northamptonshire Council, like its counterparts, is supporting the Government in its efforts to help resettle refugees from Ukraine. It is an enormous challenge, and one which will require the support and understanding of all members of North Northamptonshire Council.

Some of the details are still being worked through but it has been confirmed that once refugees have been matched with host families, they can begin the visa application process.

The Government is carrying out the visa checks and once these are cleared, applicants will be given leave to travel to the UK.



Local authorities are being provided with £10,500 per person relocated to their area, from which they will be required to cover a number of things including:

- Assessing the host properties
- Carrying out Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks on hosts - enhanced checks will be required for homes which will be hosting children or vulnerable adults
- Providing immediate financial assistance, potentially until access to benefits and work entitlement is arranged
- Continuing to support the household over the first 12 months and help with access to services and integration into UK systems and processes.

Partner agencies are gearing up to help support on a number of other fronts such as access to health services, social care, and education.

Support from residents of Northamptonshire:

Everywhere you look, local people are doing whatever they can to support Ukrainians. In Raunds a local group have collected clothing, medical equipment and food - secured the services of lorries and drivers, and driven the supplies to the Ukrainian border. Similar voluntary work is happening in Corby, Thrapston, Irthlingborough, Rushden and across the length and breadth of our county.

In Oundle, as just one further example, the local schools are working together to support ANY children displaced by what is happening in the Ukraine who may arrive in the Oundle community during the coming weeks and months.

They have committed to work together to offer the children welcome, school places for continuity of their education and support with their transition to the UK, drawing upon the expertise and experience available in their schools. Again this is being replicated by others across the county.

Higher energy and food prices: Sadly this is inevitable. Whilst the UK are less dependent than most on Russian energy (about 3% of the UKs gas requirements are from Russia, compared to an average of 35% across the continent), the impact of restrictions on the import of Russian energy will be felt by every one of us. Similarly with food, the Ukraine is a major producer of grain, and obviously its exports will be cut massively this year and, no doubt, next. With energy and food prices increasing, the standards of living will naturally fall. There will be global shortages, but we should be mindful that, whilst we will all feel the effects, it is the poorest nations that will be hit hardest.

Rishi Sunak – Spring Statement: A few days ago the Chancellor delivered his mini-budget, one that seeks to combat the cost-of-living squeeze. Fuel duty has been cut, national insurance thresholds have been raised, and various VAT rates have been reduced. Councils will get another £500m for the Household Support Fund, which is designed to help vulnerable households with rising living costs. This is on top of the previously announced energy bill rebate. It is difficult to see how much further the Chancellor could have gone with tax cuts, with huge amounts of money still required for the NHS, and maybe defence spending. Mr Sunak gave a stark warning about the 'challenging' global outlook and said the government must take a 'responsible and sustainable' approach to its finances.

He said that Britain was using its might to back Ukraine in the standoff with Russia, and even though sanctions are 'working' there was an impact on the UK's recovery, with growth now only expected to be 3.8% this year rather than 6 % and inflation to average 7.4%.

Either way, it is going to be a difficult period for a lot of people.

On a lighter note: Whilst world events are at the forefront of our minds, of course life goes on. I'd like to say a big Thank you to Ray Jackson and Ray Boyd, for putting on the President's Lunch at Glapthorn Village Hall. It was great to finally be able to have a social event where we could meet face to face. The food was delicious as always, the raffle prizes were very well received (thanks Mr President), and everyone enjoyed each other's company. Thanks also to Jason Smithers, Leader of North Northamptonshire Council, for taking a Q&A session from attendees.

William Powell: It was incredibly sad to hear the news of William Powell's passing. William, a senior barrister born in Wales, was the first Conservative MP to serve in the newly-created constituency of Corby, and won 3 elections, serving from 1983 to 1997 in which time he was also Parliamentary Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Environment. . He has remained a friend and supporter of CENCA ever since, and recently praised Tom for his "excellent work". He will be remembered for the huge contribution he made to local residents. Our thoughts go out to his wife, Elizabeth, and their 3 daughters.

The Ukraine.

While we all try to revive our optimism for a durable piece we cannot see how an invader can win the hearts and minds of the county he is trying to occupy by killing its inhabitants and possibly trapping 300 women and children in cellars under a theatre, using its soldiers to gun down anyone who attempts to rescue them. Such cruelty will never be forgotten by this generation of Ukrainians. Yet if the Russians really intended 'war', would they allow the trains to run, bringing fresh troops to the battle, using precision rockets to destroy a large oil depot but only injuring 4 people? We trust our reporters whom we see and have seen for many years on our TVs to the extent we totally trust their accuracy, especially when they occasionally qualify their reports by saying their information is second hand. Should the Russians now 'win', they face guerrilla resistance such as the Nazis had to deal with in occupied France.

Talks for peace against this background are very welcome. The Ukrainians have made some fresh suggestions such as making Ukraine a neutral country, but this would have to have the support of the electorate and be guaranteed by other countries with enough military power to deal with any one breaking agreed rules. There is talk of giving Mr. Putin the appearance of success to take to his people to show he has 'won'. But he does not understand public opinion so this is a waste of time. And anyway it would take a year to organise.

Peace will be found as most countries passionately desire it. Countries like Egypt and India do not oppose the Russians because they are dependent on grain supplies from Russia and possibly do not want to be tied any closer to America. China is ambivalent because it might help them justify taking Taiwan. (This is your Sinophile writing!).

THANK GOODNESS LABOUR DIDN'T WIN THE LAST ELECTION

As the threat from Putin was obvious to the whole world in the days before the invasion of Ukraine, Diane Abbott was still insisting: *'The claims that Russia is the aggressor should be treated sceptically. The destabilisation in the entire region comes from a continued eastward expansion of NATO.'*

Stop the War — which counts leading lights of the Left including MPs Diane Abbott and Jeremy Corbyn among its most significant figures — spent the weeks leading up to the current conflict criticising NATO and the West, and parroting the Kremlin's concerns instead of supporting the Ukrainian defenders. Abbott, a former Shadow Home Secretary, did not condemn Russia's war preparations at that 'emergency' meeting of the 'Stop the War' group on 10 February — or even defend Ukraine's right to exist as a sovereign democracy.

The former shadow home secretary backed the Russian narrative and said that NATO was to blame for the current situation.

Ms Abbott told a meeting of the Stop the War Coalition on 10 Feb: *"We see that the United States has decided that it needs to send US and other NATO troops to Russia's borders.*

"This alone should tell us that the claims that Russia is the aggressor should be treated sceptically.

"The destabilisation in the entire region comes from the continued eastward expansion of NATO. "We need to find peaceful solutions to a complicated conflict of identities and national rights.

"This was done elsewhere in Eastern Europe as countries were peacefully separated."

She also blamed the UK of being "gung ho" for war. She said: *"We need de-escalation and dialogue, not militarisation and threats of war."*

The Ukraine. On Wednesday 16 March, it was a privilege to lead for the Government in my role as a Home Office Minister during the Opposition Day debate on Ukrainian refugees, my contribution to which you can see here: <https://tinyurl.com/y9x3vtlh>

During the debate, I was able to set out the approach the Government is taking to mobilise successfully the many incredibly kind offers of support we are seeing, through our generous, uncapped Ukraine Family Scheme and the Homes for Ukraine 'sponsorship' route.

Indeed, I salute the solidarity being shown by people across this country towards the people of Ukraine, reflected in the generosity of spirit we are seeing, and as reflected at the vigil outside the Corby Cube recently that I was privileged to attend. I know a similar event subsequently took place in Oundle. I also wanted to share a link to the official gov.uk website page, where there is useful guidance and advice setting out how people in the UK can best practically support the people of Ukraine, including through refugee 'sponsorship'. Pen Green Children's Centre.

I want to give a little more detail about the intensive work that is ongoing to support the Pen Green Children's Centre in Corby

with their current discussions with North Northamptonshire Council in relation to their forward funding allocation.

Over the last few weeks, I have had a number of meetings with the leadership team at the Pen Green Centre in relation to their correspondence with the local authority and the Department for Education around their core funding allocations for the coming years.

At this stage, no final decisions have been made by the local authority, but as someone who has long supported Pen Green and proactively assisted them in successfully resolving various funding issues in years gone by, I am again actively supporting them by pursuing the urgent queries that they have relating to their future funding.

Indeed, when raising these matters with Education Ministers and with North Northamptonshire Council, I have consistently emphasised as the local Member of Parliament, my view that the Government's intentions - dating right back to the discussions of 2016 that I helped to arrange - around its funding for Corby children, should be respected and maintained, and that what has been allocated nationally for Corby provision, should continue to be spent here. Suffice to say, I have impressed that the uncertainty around this is causing increasing concern amongst my constituents and is a source of great alarm for some.

As I always have, I will continue to assist in any way that I can in getting to the bottom of this and I can reassure people locally that I know how important this provision is for children and families within our town.

Planning Matters 1. I recently wrote to North Northamptonshire Council to convey the objections of a large number of local residents from Titchmarsh, Thrapston, and the surrounding villages to planning application NE/22/00151/FUL. I am always happy to help ensure my constituent's concerns are heard clearly. I have also specifically asked the council to take a broader view around prioritising the use of brownfield land for industrial development such as this, as opposed to using greenfield sites that are, rightly, prized so strongly within our rural communities and which should only be developed in extremis. I will continue to work closely with residents to ensure that these views are fed into the planning process and properly taken account of when decisions are made by councillors.



Planning Matters 2. I am really pleased the controversial St Christopher's Drive planning application in Oundle has been withdrawn. It was originally due to be decided by the North Northamptonshire Council Area Planning Committee on Monday 21 March but this meeting became unnecessary. This is very welcome news - and an application I have long supported residents in opposing, along with NNC Councillors Helen Harrison and Jason Smithers. Hopefully that's the end of the matter!

DVLA. Across the past few months I have been assisting a sizeable number of constituents in their correspondence with the DVLA and a common problem that constituents are encountering is an inability to get in contact with someone to discuss their case. I am acutely aware that in many cases delays can have impacts on people's employment, or can affect important day-to-day life. I'm always really happy to help raise individual cases and to try and get them expedited or looked into in more detail wherever necessary, so please do get in touch with me if you are experiencing problems such as those I have described.

The Core at Corby. Recently, I had a catch-up meeting with the Director of The Core at Corby Cube to discuss how the theatre is doing now that restrictions have lifted and how they have dealt with the transition under the new local authority, given its ongoing support. It is a much loved local facility and I'll continue to support culture in Corby in any way that I can - they have a packed programme for the year ahead,

Small Boat Crossings. I recently took part in Home Office Questions, answering a couple of questions from MPs on the topics of the Nationality & Borders Bill and our plan to end dangerous small boat crossings of the Channel, as well as the removal of individuals from our country with no right to be here, or who have committed serious criminality.

Corby Urgent Care Centre. I recently had another useful call with representatives from OneMedical Group to discuss the Corby Urgent Care Centre. I am always so conscious of just how well used and valued this service is locally and so sustained engagement with its management is crucial. As promised in a previous update, I have been keeping a close eye on progress in recent times to ensure the best service possible for local residents is maintained - and of course, to champion its importance for the years ahead on an ongoing basis.

As we make headway into 2022.

I just wanted to restate that I am always available to hear your concerns and worries, or about any issues that you may be facing and would appreciate some help with. You can get in touch via telephone, letter, or email and can also organise an appointment for one of my weekly surgeries if you would like to have a more detailed discussion.

More Bobbies on the Beat

A major new focus on local policing in Northamptonshire means Police officers in neighbourhood teams across rural and urban communities will be doubled, growing from 50 to 100 over the next 18 months, with an aim to add a further 60 in coming years.

These will be additional officers to add to the neighbourhood police and PCSOs already working across the county.

Neighbourhood policing will now be at the heart of our fight against crime, with visible, locally accountable policing to tackle the problems that matter to people.



This new focus has been made possible by the increased number of police officers in the Force. Northamptonshire Police now has 1367 police officers compared with 1170 four years ago.

This means that we can now strengthen our neighbourhood teams without taking resources from emergency response or other specialist areas of crime fighting.

We are also investing in two mobile police stations to give more visible and accessible local policing in our more remote and rural communities.

Scores are on the doors for licensed premises

Licensed premises of all kinds across Northamptonshire are being encouraged to take part in a pioneering new scheme to help make their venue more safe and secure for the benefit of customers, staff, and the wider community.

I am asking premises to take part in Licensing SAVI (Safety and Vulnerability Initiative), the first ever national policing award for venues that helps them meet their statutory requirements and police and council licensing objectives. The scheme is part of my plans to tackle violence against women and girls and make our towns safer.

"I want to encourage as many licensed premises as possible to give themselves a health check and take the Licensing SAVI assessment. My ambition is for every licensee right across the county to take part and show their customers that they take safety seriously"

"By working in partnership with venues around the county, we can provide safer and more secure places. As Commissioner, I am committed to doing everything practical I can to make women and girls safer."

Venues that pass the accreditation are awarded a star rating that they can display on their premises to show their customers the effort they have made to improve safety and security.

Cadet schemes give young people a boost

Working out what you want to do for a living can often be difficult but for young people considering joining the emergency services the Cadet scheme can help set them on their way. The Northamptonshire Emergency Services Cadets helps to arm young people aged between 13 and 18 with some of the key skills they would need to join any of the emergency services – whether it's as a firefighter, police officer or paramedic. Cadets attend weekly sessions in term time to learn the skills of the trade, as well as volunteering within their local community to make a positive impact and take part in events and parades.

When cadets turn 16, they can then specialise in one of the three emergency services. Michelle Bates is the Youth Engagement Officer for Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service and is the Unit Commander for the specialist Fire Cadets.



Michelle said: “We can give transferable skills which they can take into any situation. Support for victims of Hate Crime is vitally important and if they receive a bad response they could be lost to services and never have the confidence to report again. Hopefully this helpline will demonstrate that they can access expert support and be assured that any report they make will be robustly dealt with.”

Carers helping fight against fraudsters

Operation Repeat, a scheme that is training health and social care workers from across the county to recognise doorstep crime and fraud offences, has reached more than 200 care professionals, thanks to funding from the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner. The scheme launched in Northamptonshire in September 2021 and will have delivered 12 training sessions to members of the health and social care sector by the end of March.

Numerous offences have already been reported and prevented following these training sessions. Within three days of attending an Operation Repeat session a carer was able to recognise an attempted courier fraud whilst visiting a client and was able to intervene and cut off the call. A romance fraud was also avoided after a carer recognised signs of a scam when a friend spoke about her online relationship. Thankfully the friend did not part with any money and ended the relationship immediately.

New Smoke Hoods now in use

New smoke hoods that are now on every fire engine in the county have already proven a great investment being first used at a block of flats in Oakley Street, Northampton in the January.

The hoods offer a one-time use for 15 minutes of protection from breathing in toxic fumes during a blaze.

Northamptonshire Fire & Rescue Service bought 120 smoke hoods using special funding secured from the Government to support developments after the Grenfell fire.

It's been a busy time recently for tree planting. The Council is working hard alongside town and parish councils and other organisations to get their trees planted before the end of March to get the most out of the current tree planting season. To date, the Council has planted nearly 2,000 trees for the Platinum Jubilee and we will be making sure we log these, if you pardon the pun, on the Queen's Green Canopy online map.

Some key dates:

Thursday 2 June - Light a beacon for the Jubilee. The traditional ceremony of lighting the beacons will take place throughout the United Kingdom. Towns and parishes across North Northamptonshire are being encouraged to get involved.

Thursday will also see the Trooping of the Colour, with 1,400 soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians coming together to mark the Queen's official birthday. The parade will begin at Buckingham Palace, continuing through The Mall to Horse's Guard Parade, and closing with a traditional RAF fly-pass.

Friday 3 June - Thanksgiving service. A service of Thanksgiving is to be held at St Paul's Cathedral, with more information to be announced at a later date.

Saturday 4 June - Countywide Jubilee pageant. Plans are under way to organise a countywide Jubilee pageant through Northampton town centre, involving military personnel and community groups.

- The BBC will be broadcasting a live concert from Buckingham Palace, Platinum Party at the Palace, where some of the biggest names in entertainment will be performing live and celebrating the most significant moments from The Queen's 70 years of service. Details on how to apply for tickets will be released at a later date.

Sunday 5 June - Big Lunch and national pageant

- The Big Lunch, which has helped to bring communities together since 2009, will be inviting communities together as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. Providing ideas for hosting an event, The Big Lunch can be as big as a street party, or as small as a garden barbecue. Plans are underway for a The Big Picnic Lunch event in North Northamptonshire. We're pleased to announce this will take place at Wicksteed Park and an official press release will be issued soon providing more details about the event.

- A Jubilee Pageant will also be hosted, with 5,000 performers from the United Kingdom and Commonwealth combining a variety of performance arts to commemorate both Her Majesty, and the collective celebratory efforts of people worldwide.

Local community and voluntary groups can also apply for a series of grants to help fund arts and sport projects commemorating the jubilee, including Arts Council England's Let's Create Jubilee Fund and Sport England's Platinum Jubilee Activity Fund.

Royal Mail will let you 'Swap Out' these stamps for free

You will, however, be able to exchange current stamps for barcoded ones for free under Royal Mail's new 'Swap Out' scheme, which opens on 31 March 2022 and will run until 31 March 2023.
