A TRUE HORROR STORY

Last month a member (too embarrassed to reveal his name) fell for this scam. First a phone text message is received as follows:

SANTANDER: Confirmation. A new payee was added on 28/05/22. If this was NOT you, please visit <https://santander.auth-id-50.com>

Clicking here takes you to what appears to be the genuine, secure bank website. Note the 's' in the address. This should indicate a secure site. (but this is not always true). It then says it will send a One Time Passcode to verify your identity. This arrives seconds later. All seems good so far.

After returning to the website and entering the code it asks for you to log in. And at this point it captures your details. It will then ask you for your debit card details which is where the warning bells start to ring.

One hour later money starts being transferred from your various savings accounts to your current account where it is quickly withdrawn. In this case in two hours FOUR AND A HALF THOUSAND POUNDS was stolen. It is terrifying to see large chunks of money disappearing from your account under your very eyes. And you can't stop it.

We have a happy ending thankfully. After immediately reporting the details the **Santander Fraud Team** got onto it and within a week all money was retrieved and refunded. But it meant a week of sleepless nights.

Don't think it can't happen to you. Unless you are always vigilant it will.

So, never, never, ever click on these links.

NUISANCE CALLS

We've all had them and they can really be a problem. If you haven't got a spam filter phone then make .sure you lodge a complaint about nuisance calls.

Making a complaint about nuisance callers is simple and can be done at ico.org.uk.

It will take you to an online form which asks a few basic questions including the number the call was made from and the name of the organisation.

There are three stages to the process and it should take just a few minutes to complete.

If you are not online, you can report nuisance callers by contacting the regulator's helpline (0303 123 1113)

LEADER'S UPDATE 22 JULY 2022

UK's Favourite Park

Irchester Country Park is one of three parks in North Northamptonshire nominated for the 'UK's Favourite Park'

award. Fields in Trust are running a vote for the 'UK's Favourite Parks 2022' competition. Parks are nominated by their users and 364 parks have been nominated nationally. Three parks have been nominated in North Northamptonshire: Irchester Country Park, Barnwell Country Park and Corby Sculpture Park. Voting will run for six weeks, closing at noon on Thursday 18 August. Casting your vote for your favourite park is quick and easy. Simply visit the Fields in Trust website, search for nominated parks in your area and choose your favourite. After the voting has closed, the shortlist will be announced. These parks will be named 'National Favourites', before the overall winner and 'UK's Favourite Park 2022' is revealed over the August Bank Holiday weekend.

Houses of Multiple Occupancy

The Council is asking residents, landlords and others for feedback to help understand the views and experiences of people regarding Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) in North Northamptonshire. HMOs are properties rented out by more than two people who are not from the same household (i.e. family) but share basic facilities like a kitchen or bathroom. It

does not include self-contained flats where none of the facilities are shared, but includes houses containing bedsits, hostels and shared houses. The Council recognises that HMOs play an important part in the housing market and provide a vital resource for many people. The Houses in Multiple

Occupation survey is to help establish an accurate picture of how many HMOs there are, what living conditions are like and the experiences of local people. For people living in HMOs the survey asks about their experience, what issues they've had and how they have been resolved. The survey is also for landlords and other members of the public and seeks views on whether there are additional HMOs in the area that the Council is not already aware of. We will use your feedback to help make recommendations for policy and service changes to improve the Council's corporate approach to HMOs and ensure the highest standards of licensing and strong governance. Creating safer, better connected communities is a priority for the Council and making sure we have the right information in place to help us to do this is very important. The survey closes at 11:59pm on 9 September 2022.

Statement on green waste decision deferral

The Executive agreed to defer the decision relating to the future provision of green waste at its meeting on 14 July. It is anticipated that a report on the options will come back to Executive in September this year. We have

listened to feedback and the extra time will provide more opportunity to listen to residents views and to look at the options in more detail, including careful consideration at the Council's scrutiny meetings. We are aware however that whilst the delay provides more opportunity to

look at the options, it also provides a longer period of uncertainty for those residents who are currently paying a subscription charge for the service. We would like to reassure residents who are currently subscribing to the service that fairness and equity of any future approach is essential. The need for a consistent service was a very clear message that came out of the consultation and something that we are committed to. Until a decision is made on how the Council proceeds with the service the current approach will remain. Once a decision has been made by the Executive, we will explore the impact that may have on existing subscription users in the East Northamptonshire area and consider the next steps.

Highway Improvements

At the meeting of its Executive on 14 July, North Northamptonshire Council approved setting aside £1.5million from the Council's budget underspend for 2021/22. The money will be put into a reserve specifically to enable important repairs across North Northamptonshire including:

- potholes
- white line painting
- clearance of overgrown vegetation
- sign cleaning
- and more.

These works are additional to budget commitments already made in Highways services.



Isham Bypass scheme

Consultation is now underway for the Isham Bypass scheme and people are encouraged to give their feedback on this important project for the area. The A509 Isham Bypass scheme has been developed to address existing traffic issues through Isham and to accommodate the anticipated traffic growth in the coming years. Delivery of the Isham Bypass scheme is a priority project for the Council as it seeks to

provide a range of benefits to the local community and road users, including improving congestion, better travel times, and reduced traffic noise and pollution within Isham. The consultation period will be open until 26 August.

Several consultation sessions are scheduled where people can speak with the planning team. These in-person sessions will be held in Kettering, Wellingborough and Isham. People can also visit the online consultation room. The scheme's Outline Business Case (OBC) for Government funding for construction and the Planning Application are currently anticipated to be finalised and submitted by late 2022.

Walk around in Corby to discuss the nearly £20 million 'Corby Town Deal' funded projects:

I've produced a number of past updates discussing the exciting 'Corby Town Deal' funding that was made available by the Government, with £19.9 million set to come to Corby. It was great to take a walk through the town with officers from North Northamptonshire Council, along with Councillor Jason Smithers, the Leader of the Council, to discuss the projects that are set to benefit from this funding, generating the next phase of growth and development in our town.

It was particularly useful to understand the latest with regard to each and particularly to see the new sixth form college provision taking shape in Chisholm House. I am proud to have campaigned for this significant investment and we are now seeing it through.

Latest catch-up meeting with Tata Steel and my visit to Downing Street with 'steel town' colleagues:

Corby has an incredibly rich and proud history of steelmaking and I wanted to talk about two recent steel related meetings that I had on the same day. It was really useful to have one of my regular catch-up meetings with Tata Steel, to discuss their plans for the future of steelmaking in our town and hear more about the exciting investment that the company recently announced into the site. I also attended an event in Downing Street, hosted by the PM, with other MPs whose constituencies have their roots in the steel industry too, and it was fantastic to be able to

get together and discuss ways in which we can support this vital national industry going forward, and help it grow. What is clear is that it continues to produce the best steel in the world - we must champion it at every turn

Update on Ukraine:

It is fair to say that we all continue to be desperately saddened and immensely troubled by the constant pictures we are seeing on our television screens and are worried for all of those affected in Ukraine, including those displaced by the catastrophe that has been unfolding. We also think of all those who have lost their lives and those who have lost loved ones in this senseless, brutal conflict.

We must not let this conflict escape from our consciousness and I continue to ensure that all views are heard by Ministers as our response develops to the unfolding situation. I also happen to think it was important that the Prime Minister was again in Ukraine a couple of week's ago - reflecting our country's ongoing, world-leading support of the Ukrainian people, that President Zelensky has consistently recognised and highlighted. Boris Johnson specifically announced on his visit that a new UK-led training scheme will have the potential to train up to 10,000 Ukrainian soldiers every 120 days and would allow them to "accelerate their deployment, rebuild their forces and scale-up their resistance". I strongly support this commitment.

I also really do welcome the approach the Government is taking to mobilise successfully the many incredibly kind offers of support we are seeing, through our generous, uncapped, Ukraine Family Scheme and the Homes for Ukraine 'sponsorship' route. So far, over 130,000 visas have been issued to Ukrainians, with people arriving every day to join family members or those generously opening their homes to help. Some of the stories that have been shared with me over recent weeks and months are enormously heartwarming and I am so proud and appreciative of the community response here in Corby & East Northamptonshire. I know we will continue to do all we can to support the Ukrainian people and will not allow the focus on their plight to be lost.

Making our streets safer

I am particularly proud to have been one of the Ministers responsible for taking the Police, Crime, Sentencing & Courts Act through Parliament, which has delivered several key reforms I have championed. The Act was commenced last Tuesday and amongst the measures that have come into force are:

- Serious offenders will spend longer in jail, including sex offenders, child abusers and those who kill emergency workers in the course of their duties.
- We are also protecting breastfeeding women from being photographed without their consent.
- And we are giving the victims of domestic abuse longer to report the crime to the police, to help ensure they get justice.



These are landmark reforms that will better protect the public and keep our streets safer, including here in Corby & East Northamptonshire.

As we approach what I hope will be a pleasant summer break, a host of summer activities are planned to help build relationships between local police officers and young children who are at risk of exploitation – as well as delivering key life and safety messages to them.

The sessions are being delivered by the Youth Service of the Office of the Northamptonshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC), and have been designed specifically to engage with young people in the community who may be at risk of becoming involved in gangs, adopting anti-social behaviour or to vulnerable young people being exploited.

The first week of the programme will see young people take part in party escape rooms, where they will be set a series of challenges that will address issues and raise awareness on keeping safe, alcohol, drugs, consent and safer relationships.

The second week will include a big board game challenge educating participants on stop and search procedures by the police, as well as splash sessions teaching them valuable water safety lessons; while the third week's activities will focus on learning about emotional wellbeing and protective behaviours.

The final two weeks will include 'Saved by the Bell' sessions which address hate crimes, while 'Back of the Net' drills and a football match against police staff followed by a BBQ will help to build positive relationships between young people and the police.

We need to do as much as we can to protect young people in Northamptonshire, which is why I have significantly invested in this area. The Youth Service in my department has worked with more than 4,000 children and young people since it was established, and I am sure this programme of events will prove very valuable in educating them and helping to prevent them from becoming involved in or becoming victims of crime."

AN IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

As most members will know, membership records and renewals are gradually being transferred to Conservative Central Office.

Our local office is still able to take and process renewals from members but all new applications for membership have to go through CCHQ. So we have a dual system in place for the foreseeable future but the plan is for all membership records eventually to be handled centrally.

Our Association was one of the trial areas for this new system and so far it seems to be working reasonably well.

However, one problem has arisen and this is causing some difficulties for a few members.

The problem comes when a new member joins and pays their subscription on SO via a debit/credit card.

What we have found is when a card expires the membership for that person is cancelled. No reminder seems to be sent out and the member does not realise that they are no longer a member. When the cancellation is realised the member has to rejoin and loses their record of continuous membership.

Obviously with any new system there will be glitches but this particular one seems to have slipped through the net.

The problem will be reported at the next meeting of Area Associations on 25th July and hopefully a solution will be found by the technical people at CCHQ.

If you are not sure about your membership status please contact the office and your record can be checked.

(This expiry date problem affects other services such as PayPal, etc but these companies usually notify you of the expiry.)

TOM PURSGLOVE, MP's WEEKLY ADVICE SURGERIES



As your local MP, Tom believes it is extremely important to be as accessible as possible, in order to be able to best help with any problems or concerns that his constituents have. As such, he holds weekly advice surgeries.

To book an appointment, please telephone 020 7219 8043, or email pursglovet@parliament.uk, as he operates his surgeries on an appointments basis, utilising virtual, telephone and face-to-face methods - ensuring that his constituents do not have to rush through their concerns and to best meet people's individual circumstances and requirements.

This approach also allows him to provide immediate help - he often makes a start on casework matters prior to an appointment, to try and resolve concerns more quickly, whilst it also allows him to seek any appropriate advice, or obtain clarification on technical points, in advance of meeting.

Tom is sure people will appreciate why the venues are not listed - the official security advice remains that MPs should not disclose this information publicly, given the appalling attacks we have seen, with terrible consequences, but Tom is always willing to discuss any issue of concern with his constituents and makes appropriate arrangements to do so.

THE LEADERSHIP ELECTION

The Party member ballot will close at **5pm on Friday 2nd September**. Ballots received after that time will not be counted. The winner will be announced on **Monday 5th September**. That winner will become Leader of the Conservative Party and our next Prime Minister.

Party members who have been members for at least three months immediately prior to the close of the ballot shall be entitled to vote. This means only current members who joined on or before 3rd June 2022 will receive a ballot.

The final two leadership candidates will travel around the UK and make their pitch to members. Members will be able to ask questions of both candidates during the hustings. We'll hold several hustings across the country (and streamed online), details of which will be advertised shortly

Qualifying members will be sent a ballot pack by post to their registered membership address. The ballot pack will contain a paper ballot that can be returned in the post. The pack will also contain details of how to vote online and two unique security codes that must be entered in order to do so. We recommend online voting where possible. It is your choice which method of voting you choose. You can only vote once and should a duplicate vote be received by our ballot company, only the last received vote will count.

All ballots must be received by 5pm on Friday 2nd September. For your vote to count you must be an active member of the Party

immediately prior to the ballot closing. Please allow sufficient time in case of unexpected postal delays. Online voting is available until close of ballot. Ballot packs for qualifying members will begin to land on doorsteps from Monday 1st August. You can expect to receive it between 1st and 5th August. We cannot post ballot packs to temporary addresses. If you have not received your ballot pack by close of business Monday 8th August please contact us at leadership@conservatives.com and we will arrange for a replacement ballot pack to be dispatched. **Please do not enquire about lost ballot packs before Monday 8th August.**

Qualifying members with a non-UK membership address will NOT receive a postal ballot pack. They will receive an email containing the two unique security codes allowing them to vote online. This email will be sent on Tuesday 2nd August.

If you will not be at your registered membership address to access your ballot pack before the ballot closes, you may apply for an email to be sent containing your two secure codes, allowing you to vote online. More information will be made available in due course via the Conservative website on how to access this facility.

Membership cards or membership certificates are not required to vote in this or other Party elections nor to attend a hustling. Membership cards are no longer produced for Party members.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE CONSERVATIVE PARTY

To minimise local administration, the Voluntary Party's Membership Committee has recommended that no new **local** Standing Orders or Bank Transfers are set up from now on. They advise associations to direct members to pay through Direct Debit or Credit/Debit Card (online or via the CCHQ Membership Team). Please note, the money received by Associations remains the same whether payments are made centrally or locally. CHARITY APPEAL

Florence Bark, a little girl living in Corby, who turned six earlier this month, became ill at the beginning of May and was diagnosed with AML about two weeks later. According to charity Blood Cancer UK, only 100 children in the UK are diagnosed with AML every year. Two weeks into her treatment, Florence was found to be in the "high risk" category - and further genetic testing confirmed a rare gene rearrangement that affects less than 10% of children with AML.

Florence Bark might need treatment that is not available on the NHS and the family started a fund to raise the massive half a million pounds which could be needed. (The family have pledged that if the money cannot be used for Florence then all funds will go forward to help another child.)

On hearing the news the communities of Corby and surrounding towns swung into action and in a few weeks the half-a-million pound total has been hit.

Following the recent generous donation by Club members of £782.25 for Lakelands Hospice and the Charity Pot Corby Conservative Club members responded immediately to this appeal to help save the life of Florence and in just over two weeks Corby Conservative Club members raised over £1,500 for the fund. A staggering sum in such a short time.


